Dear Parents/Carers

We believe that a school uniform creates a sense of belonging and pride in the school whilst ensuring equality amongst students. We want our students to look smart and present themselves with confidence. Consistency regarding uniform is crucial and so we adopt a zero tolerance approach to untidy and inappropriate uniform. Whilst the full uniform policy is available on the website, this is a reminder that-

Jewellery

Only one plain stud in each ear and a wrist watch may be worn. Students with any other piercings will not be allowed into lessons. Piercings have to be removed or students will be placed in Internal Exclusion. It is clear in our policy that we advise that if students have piercings they are done at the beginning of the summer holidays, so that they can be removed before returning to school. Covering of piercings is not accepted.

Make Up

Students are not allowed to wear make-up, apart from discreet foundation. They will be asked to remove unacceptable make-up. Nail varnish and false nails/eyelashes must not be worn.

Bags

School rucksack with school logo. All students must have their school bag each day.

Shoes

Smart, flat, formal black shoes (No boots, trainers or canvas shoes will be tolerated). If your child has podiatry issues then black, appropriate footwear may be worn with medical evidence, until the issue has been resolved.

If students are unable to rectify their uniform by returning home/having correct items brought in or borrowing items from the school then they will not be able to be in circulation at unstructured time and may be placed in the Internal Exclusion room until rectified. Refusal by the student to rectify uniform infringements including jewellery will lead to being placed in Internal Exclusion until the uniform is rectified.

We appreciate that some families may be experiencing financial difficulty in the purchase of uniform or essential equipment; parents/carers are invited to contact their child's Director of Learning so that we can support. We are looking forward to all our students returning after the half term break, in perfect uniform and fully focused on their learning.
