Dear Parents/Carers,

On 2 March 2023 teachers within the NEU will be taking their second day of industrial action. To ensure that we can provide educational provision to as many as possible, we are seeking confirmation from parents/carers as to those who will be wanting to send their child(ren) into school on this date.

Work will be available on Teams for students who are not in school on 2 March 2023.

Students in Years 11 & 13 who are scheduled to sit an exam on this date as part of their timetabled exam week should attend for their exam (exams scheduled for this date are as following:

Year 11 (Arundel Road Site)

9.00am : Spanish Writing

11.15am : Business

1.30pm : PE

Year 13 (Sports Hall)

9.00am : English, French, DT & Computer Science

1.00pm : Business, History, Physics & English Lang/Lit

Please note that we will not be able to guarantee provision for all additional students, and will be prioritising provision as follows:

1. Vulnerable learners e.g. EHCP, LAC, considered in need by the Children Act 1989
2. Children of critical workers (NHS, uniformed services and educational staff where all parents/carers at the home address are employed in these fields)
3. Students in Years 11 and 13 preparing for exams who find it difficult to study at home
4. Children of parents/carers who may be liable to lose a day's pay to provide childcare
5. Children of all other parents/carers
