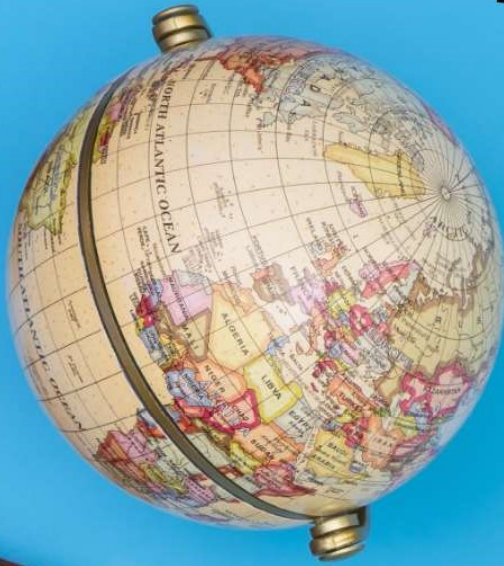

CONDUCT and RULES

Be nice to each other – we are all a team and ambassadors for our school and country

But also....

- Be responsible for yourself and others at all times
- Students must go around in groups of no fewer than 3 or 4 according to the instructions of the group leader
- Students are expected to listen attentively and respond to instructions given.

- If you have a mobile phone, be careful with data roaming. Limit use of 4G. Talk to parents about this. The school is NOT liable for any loss/ theft or damage to any personal belongings, including mobile phones. *Please ensure you have your own insurance for this.*
- Bring an adaptor and charger for phone.
- **SMOKING, VAPING AND ALCOHOLIC DRINKS ARE NOT ALLOWED AT ANY TIME**

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Money and passports:

Pocket money recommendations;

£20/30 English Currency (in case)

50/100 euros for use in France (parents discretion)

Breakfast, lunch and dinner are provided therefore students will only require additional money for snacks and purchasing any gifts. Staff will be responsible for pocket money, which will be issued to students once a day, then locked back up in the safe.

Please ensure that money is in an envelope with your child's name on it and the amount of money enclosed clearly labeled on the front of the envelope. Cards can be kept by the student but this is their responsibility.

Pocket money will be collected when dropping off luggage on the day of departure by staff so please pack this in your child's hand luggage. This money is the student's responsibility until a member of staff collects it from them and records the amount of money given to them.

Please double-check the following:

- Please can you double-check that passports are valid until at least **3 months and 1 day after the day of arrival back in England, which is 30 September 2023.**
- If your child is travelling with a European passport, please can you check that your **settled status** is linked to the child's travelling passport for re-entry to the UK. (Or give me a paper copy)
- Please can you also check that all of the latest **medical and dietary details** for your child have been put on to the Parentpay portal. M Vidon will be 'Monsieur Meds' for the trip and please hand any medicine to him in a named plastic wallet, with **written** instructions for dosage, before departure on Monday 26 June. If you have specified that your child can need an inhaler, it **MUST** be brought with you.

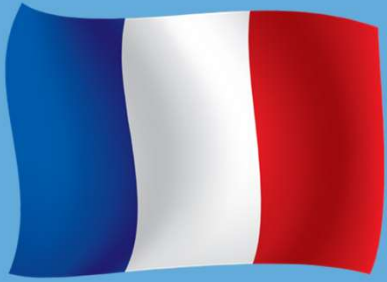

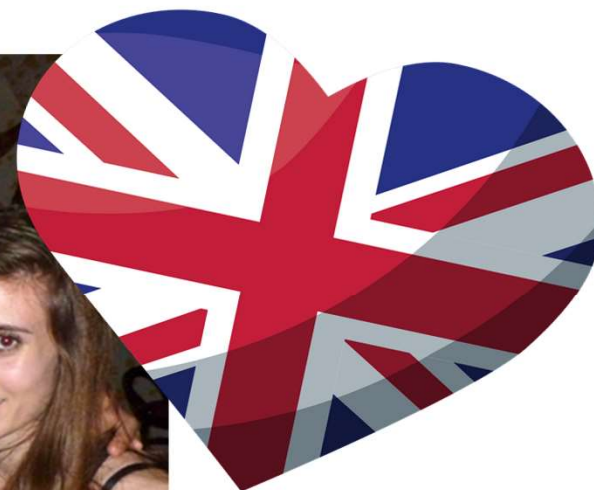
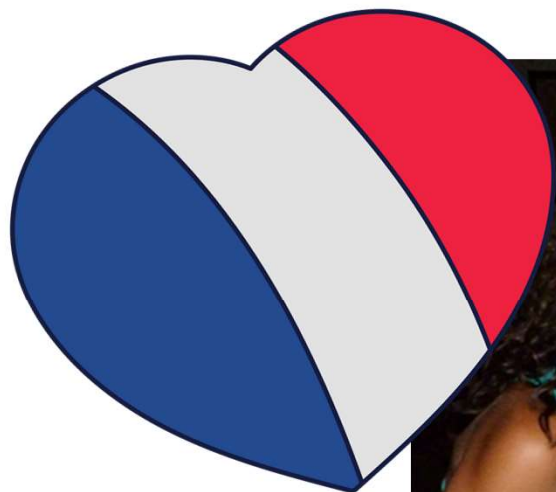


PEN-PALS!
