Hard

The overarching aim of the person development curriculum is to help students develop into positive members of society who are motivated, ambitious, respectful and knowledgeable about society and culture. We consider what has happened in the past and what is happening now; we learn about issues that affect people locally and around the world; we introduce inspiring people who have overcome challenges, advanced equality, or enhanced life for others.

Through the content, we provide a weekly opportunity to reflect on the qualities and experiences that make each of us unique and we promote diversity as essential to humanity. We seek to encourage students to reflect on their own ideas and beliefs, to understand and appreciate contributions from people who are different from them and to learn how to cooperate with others peacefully and effectively. The content provides opportunities to learn from inspiring people who have lived before us, to find out about career opportunities, to reflect on ways to keep ourselves healthy physically and mentally and to appreciate the freedoms and laws that we have.

Each week content around a relevant theme will be explored through; Assemblies, Votes for Schools, Literacy Activities, PSHE and Careers activities.

In Personal Development Time sessions throughout the week, students are expected to:

- discuss and ask questions about the theme of the week;
- participate in activities to deepen their knowledge and understanding of our key values by considering current affairs locally and globally;
- enhance their knowledge and understanding about careers and further education;
- extend their knowledge of mental and physical health and learn strategies to keep themselves healthy;
- enjoy reading literature as a shared experience within the tutor group;
- develop oracy skills through debate and literary exploration.
- develop an appreciation of art, dance, music and theatre.

The broad aims of our curriculum are indicated in the table below:
