What is a MEG and a SAT?

- For each subject a student gets a predictor produced by Fischer Family Trust (FFT).
- The predictors are used to inform the setting of ambitious and aspirational expected grades for students.
- The FFT database predicts the GCSE grades that students with the same contextual information (such as how many times they have moved schools) and levels at KS2 are most likely to achieve; we use this as the **Minimum Expected Grade (MEG)**.
- Students at Seaford Head School, however make better progress than the national average, and we therefore expect a Student to be aiming for their **Student Aspirational Target (SAT)**. The **Student Aspirational Target** will ensure they are challenged to realise their full potential.


Report One & Two
