







Skills demand in East Sussex





 \pounds 2,160 per month using the HM Revenue and Customs Pay As You Earn Real Time Information in December 2023.




Median pay, seasonally adjusted, UK, NUTS3 level, December 2023

Focus on - Retrofit

Retrofit is any improvement work on an existing building to improve its energy efficiency, making them easier to heat, able to retain that heat for longer, and replacing fossil fuels with renewable energy.

The retrofit landscape at a national and a local level requires a significant number of trained professionals to deliver and assess retrofitting installations.

- Around 80% of existing buildings for housing (27 million) require retrofitting upgrades.
- 5% of newly built homes in 2019 fell below the desired energy performance standards.
- To reach 2050 retrofit goals the UK must accelerate it's retrofit of homes to approximately 1,038,462 homes a year.
- 430,000 newly trained staff needed in the UK Green Housing sector.

East Sussex Initiatives

- £12 million of Green Homes Grants and Home Upgrade Grants between 2021-2025.
- £500k of business grants to enable implementation of retrofit energy efficiency measures.
- <u>East Sussex College Green Training Hub</u>, in Hampden park, operated in partnership with OHM Energy, delivering training in green technologies and retrofit, such as solar, heat pump technology and micro-wind installations.
- £240,000 of <u>DESNZ funding</u> to boost green skills through a Retrofit Skills Strategy; mapping the current green skills picture, identifying gaps and developing activities to address this. This project is being supported by the Skills East Sussex Construction Task Group.

Education and Training News

The leadership level national professional qualification (NPQ) will become the mandatory qualification for SENCOs from September 2024, replacing the NASENCO qualification. SENCOs who currently hold the NASENCO qualification or are completing the NASENCO qualification will not be required to also complete the NPQ.
