homework, writing emails in the workplace or even making a shopping list. However, 1 in 3 children currently leave primary school without the writing skills they need to succeed in life. To mark National Writing Day 2024 on Wednesday 19 June, we are very pleased to announce that Ravena Guron, winning author of the 2024's Southern Schools Book Awards, will be visiting Seaford Head School. Ravena is a London based, full-time Young Adult Literature author. Her novels usually feature antiheroines or snarky narrators. Ravena is a lawyer with a degree in biochemistry and hopes to use the knowledge gained from her studies to plot her books, whether that's wild fantasy adventures, or twisty murder-mysteries.

Ravena will be hosting an assembly for Year 9 and another for Year 10 to share her experience of her profession as a writer, and give insight to our students about her career path and the texts she has published. Later on in the day, she will be running a creative writing workshop exclusively for students who wish to sign-up in advance to participate – details on how to do so will be shared with students during English lessons. Ravena will also be hosting a meet and greet during break time in the AS LRC where she will be signing copies of her books. Her novels are available to pre-order and purchase in advance on the school shop via ParentPay. Please do so by 9am on Monday 03 June to allow us time to order and sort the stock. A list of the available texts, as well as brief blurbs, are included below. If your child is entitled to free school meals, one of Ravena's books can be purchased for them from the school budget for inclusion. Your child should request for this via one of the librarians.

We hope this celebration of the power of writing creatively will provide students with a great opportunity to celebrate the many reasons why people write - including creativity, self-expression, mental wellbeing, for professional or academic purposes, social action or human connection. We aim to encourage everyone involved to find their own writing motivation and voice.
